Mayor Olmos thanked the Community Services Commission for their services. She understands that these trying are difficult and appreciates their patients. 8. **GENERAL BUSINESS**

8.a. **COMMUNITY SERVICES MONTHLY INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

Mr. Perez stated that on Saturday, August 15th the City hosted a car parade to promote the 2020 Census in the community. He mentioned that the caravan traveled through various neighborhoods in the city to in encourage residents to fill out the 2020 Census. Mr. Perez stated the city had a backpack giveaway on Wednesday, August 19th. He stated that they were out of the backpack in 30 minutes. He mentioned that there was a seconded giveaway on Thursday, August 27th for those children that were not able to obtain a backpack at the first giveaway. Mr. Perez stated that in order to obtain a backpack a coupon had to be presented.

8.b. **Report on Department’s Programming during COVID-19**

Mr. Perez presented a report that listed events that were either cancelled or Modified due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He mentioned that the Memorial Day Ceremony was one of the events that was modified. Mr. Perez stated that another event that will be modified is the Veterans Day Ceremony. He mentioned that event will take virtually. Mr. Perez stated that the city will be asking the veteran residents send in videos and pictures while they were serving. Mr. Perez stated that the flyer will be email to the commission once it has been approved. Mr. Perez stated that the city will be hosting a virtual Patriots Day honoring September 16th. He mentioned that the video will be posted next week.

Mr. Perez stated that the 5K has been cancelled for this year. Mr. Perez stated that normally the city would host Harvest festival on October 31. He mentioned that the City will be hosting drive-through Halloween Event. Mr. Perez stated the event would be similar to what is known as Trunk-O-Treat. This year due the pandemic resident will have to remain in their vehicles and drive by a both where they can receive there treats. Mr. Perez invites the Community Services Commission to participate in the event.

Mr. Perez stated that that for the time being the Youth Basketball program has been cancelled for this fiscal year this was a recommendation that came from Los Angeles County Health Department. He mentioned the T-Ball is still on hold depending on the stated and county recommendation. Mr. Perez mentioned that

uniforms were purchased for this years T-Ball program and will be used for the next fiscal year if restriction are not lifted.

Mr. Perez stated that the city will be hosting a toy drive this year with modifications. He mentioned that the Recreation Division will be sending out a donation letter to our local businesses asking for donations. He mentioned that with the donation received staff will be purchasing toys. Mr. Perez stated that there will be an application process. He mentioned that residents must have proof a low-income status and they live in the city. He mentioned that staff is still working on a plan as to if the toys will be delivered or if will be drive-through were residents can also pick a prepackage meals. Mr. Perez stated more information will be provides as the dates comes closer.

Mr. Perez announced that the Recreation Department is doing some virtual programs and classes for example; 10K step challenge, talent show, and Little Mr. and Miss South El Mont Virtual baby pageant. He mentioned that if the class requires supplies staff will be delivering the supplies. The only things that is required is to sign up. Chairperson Romo asked if the programs and classes are posted on the City Website or Facebook. Mr. Perez stated they are posted on the City Website and it also advertised on the City newsletter.

Mr. Perez stated that the Senior Services Division has been closed to the public since Monday, March 16th to the health and safety of the seniors. He mentioned that senior center has been providing home delivered meals to safeguard seniors from having to their home to secure a meal. He mentioned that senior receive 5 frozen meals a week. Mr. Perez mentioned that the senior center will be hosting Grandparents Day Drive-Through on Thursday, September 17 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

Commissioner Ortega asked if the city is prepared to hosted the programs if Los Angeles County and Governor Newsom lifts the restriction. Mr. Perez stated that the department will be prepared if restrictions are lifted.

Mr. Perez stated that the skate park and tennis courts have been open with modifications. Mr. Perez stated the Recreation Department is following the COVID guidelines which are social distancing, there can not be more than three patrons in the courts and there can definitely not be any doubles in the tennis courts. He mentioned that the hours have also been modified. It was mentioned that is being done is in complies with the (CPRS) California Parks and Recreation Society and with CDC.

Commissioner Ortega stated that the City parks have signs posted notifying residents that closed to the public. He also mentioned that he has noticed that they have been residents coming to the park. He asked who enforces this and tells residents that the parks are closed due to the pandemic. Mr. Perez stated that it would be Parks and Recreation and Public works and the City Manager at the same time.

Commissioner Ortega asked if the boxing gym is closed to the public. City Manager Rachel Barbosa stated that the boxing gym is closed to the public

Mayor Gloria Olmos answer Commissioner Ortega's question regarding the City Parks being closed. She stated that the parks are closed. She stated that it is an open space and that if there is family for example Mayor saw a father and daughter playing ball staff would not asked them to leave, but City staff will not allow large gatherings at the parks.

Commissioner Blanco asked who cooks the meals that are being delivered to the seniors. City Manager Rachel Barbosa stated that Huntington Culinary still provides the meals, but there are certain frozen meals they do not cook. She stated that Huntington Culinary does not have the capability of freezing them in mass production, so this means that Huntington Culinary works with another vendor who is located the City of West Covina. City Manager Rachel Barbosa did mention that that Vicente does make the cold salads. Commission Blanco asked how long will the seniors be receiving the meals. City Manager Rachel Barbosa did state that the seniors will continue to receive the meals until the City receives order from the County of Los Angeles stated that the Senior Center can reopen. City Manager Rachel Barbosa did let the Community Services Commission that the Senior Center did get repainted and now has new fitness room.

Chairperson Romo suggested maybe the having volunteer do some cards to send to the senior with their lunch meals. They maybe will lift up the seniors spirit a little bit.

9. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Ortega suggested having a community group walk. He asked if this something that the city can do. Mayor Gloria Olmos stated it makes hard to start some sort of activity due to the pandemic and social distancing requirements.

Commissioner Blanco wanted to thank the Senior Services Department for sending the (PPE's) Personal Protective Equipment to all the seniors that are receiving the meals.

Mr. Perez stated reminded the Commissioners Comments is meant for the commissioners to report on meetings attended at City expense (for example, City events, conferences, etc.) He asked that any ideas or recommendation regarding programing should be place on the agenda to be discussed at the commission meetings.

Commissioner Duarte asked for clarification on commissioners' comments. He asked if someone on the commission brings an idea regarding programing it can discussed under commissioners' comments. City Manager Rachel Barbosa stated that the City Council along with the Planning, Patriotic, and Community Services Commissions follow the Brown Act. Therefore, it is required that any agenized items should be placed on the agenda and the agenda must be posted 72 hours prior

to the meeting to allow the public to be notified what will be discussed at the meeting.

Subject: Monthly Report for January 2021

SUMMARY: The health and safety of our seniors' citizens is the highest priority for the City of South El Monte. We are continuing to follow the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC, as well as state and local authorities, and are staying informed on best practices. The Senior Services Division is focused on helping seniors live safely, healthy, and independently in their own homes. During COVID-19, our services are especially vital in keeping seniors safe at home and limiting their exposure through personalized care and support.

Program Updates:

We have adjusted our in-person programs to ensure that seniors continue to stay connected to the community and staff to reduce the effects of social isolation.

Home Activities for Seniors: To help reduce the stress from the recent holidays, In January, seniors received a care package with snacks, crossword puzzle and word searches. Study have shown that crossword puzzles and word searches can engage the brain and mind, helping direct attention away from stressful situations. Crosswords also provide a way to relax and unwind

Monthly Themed Newsletter

The Senior Services Division uses the monthly newsletter to help keep seniors engaged with the community and to provide service updates. The newsletter also serves as a medium to keep seniors informed about upcoming City sponsored events, fun games along with health and exercise tips.

Senior Services Webpage

The City's Senior Services webpage was updated in January with new virtual programing and resources available during the COVID-19 pandemic. The website now includes links to senior exercises and fitness tips, mindfulness activities, virtual trips and community resources.

Daily Senior Wellness Calls: Calls are made to seniors by City staff and Commissioners. These calls offer meaningful conversations and an opportunity to check that seniors are safe and not in need of additional assistance.

Virtual Wellness Programs: The Senior Services Division partnered with Breath California in January to offer the virtual workshop: Adult Lung Health. The virtual workshop focused on showing the participants the impact of air pollution, smoking, and chemicals on lungs. All participants were offered a free consultation with a registered respiratory therapist and some also received a giftbag for participating in the workshop.

We continue to work with Partners in Care Foundation to provide evidence-based internet wellness programs that focus on keeping seniors healthy, mentally engaged, entertained, and safe in their homes. Programs include: Arthritis Foundation Exercise, Bingocize, and Chronic Disease Self-Management Programs.

Special Request Items:

Seniors communicate to City staff the items they need, then our City staff shops and delivers the items to the senior using safety protocols to keep seniors and staff safe.

Nutrition Services

The Senior Services Elderly Nutrition Program continued to provide home-delivered meals to safeguard seniors from having to leave home to secure a meal. The number of weekly meals provided through the home-delivered meals program were reduced in January from seven meals a week to five. Meal continued to be delivered twice a week to each participant. During the month of January 2,900 meals were delivered to 210 unduplicated seniors.

Transportation Services

City staff provided transportation services to eligible residents who do not drive. Our services ensure that seniors continue to live independently in their community. Transportation services were provided to medical appointments, grocery shopping and personal trips. See attached January report
